- Why might Renn be embarrassed to be seen making friends with the cub?
- What might the word quiver mean?
- Give a synonym for crunched.
- Why shouldn't they have lit a fire?
- Why do you think wolf senses that the being will be back?



### Lesson 3 and 4 – Newspaper Report

- Using events from the chapters we have read this week, you are now going to write a newspaper article informing the reader about what has happened.
- You need to write about the 5 Ws:
  - What has happened?
  - When did it happen?
  - Where did happen?
  - Who was involved?
  - Why did it happen?
  - You should try and include: fronted adverbials, direct speech, reported speech, expanded noun phrases, a range of conjunctions.
