

## Home Learning Instructions

<b>Subject:</b> Art year 7	<b>Week commencing:</b> 12/10/2020
<b>Objectives:</b>  To create a page filled with patterns inspired by the Day of the Dead. To think carefully about the use of space and line in your work.	
<b>Learning activities (in order to be completed):</b>  This week you are going to practise creating <b>Patterns</b> commonly used for decoration when celebrating 'The Day of the Dead'.  Take a look at 'Day of the Dead patterns' PowerPoint resource, and pick out all of your favourite patterns. Begin to think about patterns could merge together and change throughout the page to creating an exciting outcome.  Your aim is to fill your page with as many patterns as possible, but keep each pattern local to one area - don't spread each pattern too <b>sparsely</b> across the page. You must use up as much space as you can, this will help in making your page look exciting and full. Also think about <b>size</b> , not all patterns should be the same size - <b>variety</b> is key! You can look at the 'Year 7 art example' to inspire you.  You must aim to get these patterns drawn in pencil this week, make sure to draw with extremely <b>pale</b> lines. When you have completed it put it aside until next week's task. If you have access to a photocopier, then photocopy your art work so that you have a copy of your original drawing before adding colour.  Don't forget to email in your completed work.
